hearing the Gospel proclaimed, with tears streaming from his eyes, the young man accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Lord and Savior. For this hungry young man, the gospel got there in time!

What he was hungry for was not food to satisfy his physical hunger, but the gospel to satisfy his spiritual hunger!


Taking time to hear the gospel presented, God opened Josue's heart and he received Jesus as his Lord and Savior. Tears
