Third Annual Quichua Pastors Leadership Conference Riobamba & Guaranda

he Third Annual Quichua Pastors and Leadership Conference was held in Riobama and Guaranda, Ecuador.

Ed Balducci taught an overview of the *Book of Revelation* four days in Riobamba and then three days in Guaranda. Pam Becker received excellent responses from her Bible studies for the Quichua women in both locations.

Carmen Reinoso, from Charles Stanley organization, gave women's Bible studies on women in the Bible. Cindy Aguilar taught women how to begin Sunday Schools in their churches. Nancy Copa gave presentations on how pastors' wives can have effective ministries and build up

their husbands in ministry. We had over 400 registered participants at the two conferences.


