I LOVE TO TELL THE STORY



One glorious praise was witnessing Jose Vallejo Ramco accept Jesus Christ as his personal Lord and Savior on his 99th birthday!



Located near Suncamal was a cheese processing facility we found doing door to door evangelism. We knocked on the door and a lady came to greet us. Elizabeth, our translator, asked if we could watch the process.

The process was very interesting. The owner and her 9 year old

daughter were putting fresh cheese in molds to form (pictured above). Afterwards the molds were then placed in a press to squeeze out excess water. Once the molds were under pressure, she had some down time to visit. Jane shared the gospel with the lady and she prayed to receive Christ as her Savior.
